# Home Learning

Home Learning is a valuable tool in helping students make the most of their learning in school. We assign Home Learning because it is useful in reinforcing what has been learned in class, prepares students for upcoming lessons, teaches responsibility and helps students develop positive study habits.

# Home Learning

## Purpose of Home Learning

What do we want to achieve through Home Learning?

- Raise achievement
- Consolidate learning
- Revise, practice, and memorise skills and learning
- Partnership with parents – shared experience
- Students to apply learning to new contexts and new problems
- Promote independence within students

What do we not want to do?

- Home Learning to cause stress or anxiety
- Make parents do the Home Learning for students
- Inconsistency across the school/in the strategy



# Home Learning

Parental support is invaluable for both students and the school.

How can you help?

1. Create a space in which students can complete the work set
2. Encourage discipline by creating a routine for Home Learning
3. Reward and encourage children when they are completing the tasks set
4. Take an interest and talk with your child about their work
5. Speak to the school if there are any problems with Home Learning



# Home Learning

Home Learning tasks are set according to a schedule.

Key Stage 3: 1 piece of Home Learning per week per subject;

Key Stage 4: 2 pieces of Home Learning from Core subjects and 1 piece from Options subjects.

Teachers make students aware of the amount of time that is expected to be spent on each piece of Home Learning, the deadline for submission and whether it is to be submitted on Teams or in class.

Class Charts has not replaced online platforms (The EverLearner, Seneca, Sparx Maths etc). Subjects will continue to set tasks via these for students to complete, but communication of this will be on Class Charts.

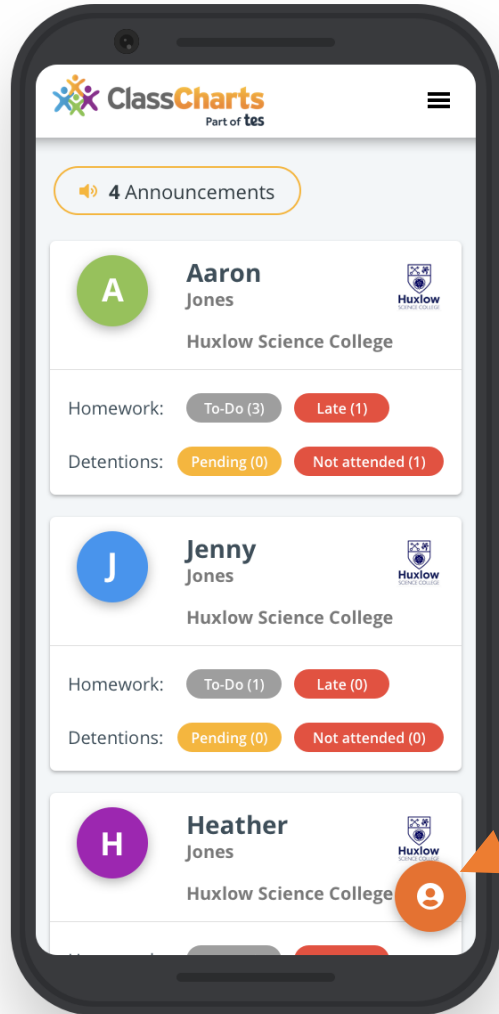

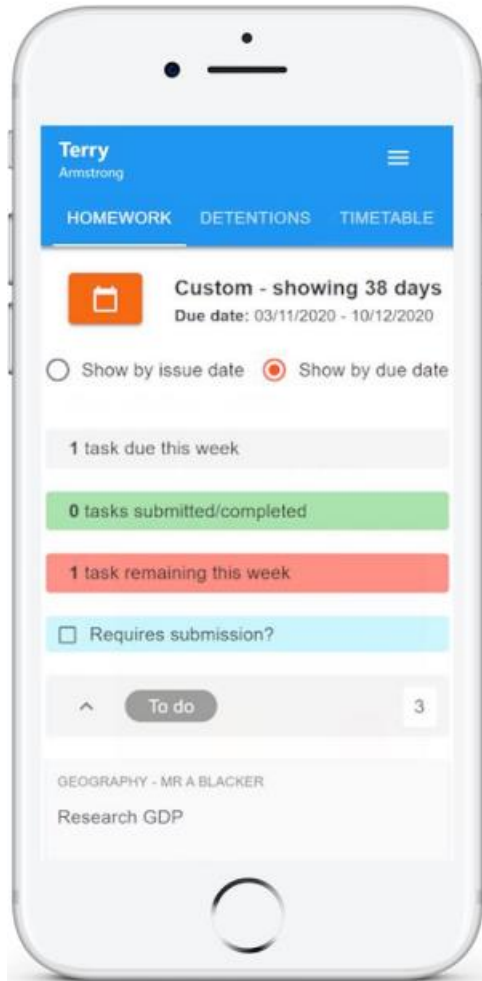
